A MESSAGE FROM Rev. Scott Faw, Rowan Southern Baptist Association Board of Directors

Dear Friends,

I trust that you and your family are doing well. The first quarter of 2024 has come and gone very quickly. One of the emphasis this year I have studied has been has been on prayer. God has used this time to challenge and help me in my life. So, I want to share some things this month with you on this subject that God is working in my heart about. Michael Catt, who is the former (now deceased) pastor of Sherwood Baptist Church in Albany, GA wrote a book entitled The Power of Persistence, and deals with the matter of prayer. I highly recommend this book, and am grateful for what it is doing in my life right now. There were a number of lines and phrases that really spoke to me in this book, but one in particular has captured my thoughts. Catt writes about Elijah and his prayer life, and he makes this statement: "According to James, Elijah was a man just like us. But the question comes: Are we men just like him?" Am I a man like Elijah? James uses Elijah's humanity as an encouragement for me to pray like the prophet. However, as I study Elijah, I am struck with how unlike him I am. For instance, I am struck by how counter-cultural Elijah was. Ahab, that "toad of a man who sat on the throne of Israel" (see "Pay-Day Someday" by R.G. Lee), had plunged the nation into an almost wholesale idolatry. The whole country it seemed had gone Baal-crazy. When you move from I Kings 16 to chapter 17, where we are introduced to Elijah, this hard-nosed, spirit-filled, God-called preacher, the contrast is striking. He stands out from the culture in a way that forces attention to what He says and what He does for God. I am afraid that as a preacher I am so run-of-the-mill, so immersed in my own culture, that I am not all that distinguished among the idol-crazed Israelites of today. I am also struck by how confident he was. He stands up, and without flinching says, "As the Lord God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, except at my word. (17:1)." How is that compared to the speculative guesses and theological musings of most preachers today? I am envious of how Elijah publicly taunts the prophets of Baal at the showdown on Mt. Carmel. When they get no response to their charismatic carnival of prayer, the Bible says, "And so it was, at noon, that Elijah mocked them and said, "Cry aloud, for he is a god; either he is meditating, or he is busy, or he is on a journey, or perhaps he is sleeping and must be awakened. (18:27)." In our day of ecclesiastical and ecumenical romance, everybody wants to hold hands with the heretics and court the affections of the apostates, but Elijah mocked them publicly. Elijah may have been a man like me, but I am not sure that I am a man like him. However, the good news is that while I am no Elijah, I know Elijah's God! My mantle and my ministry may be much smaller than his, but I know that the same God who called him, and upon whom he called is the same God I serve. With that in mind, what God did through Elijah He can still do today. The servants may change, but the Savior does not. Would you pray with me that God would do a supernatural work like that here in our association of churches? God is able to transform the lives of mankind just like in times past. When he changes lives then our churches will change too.






April 7, 2024

A few years ago, Stephen and Lisa Shaw arrived in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, to replant Sequoyah Creek Church. In just a small amount of time, the Shaws have led the church to be involved in giving back to their community and around the world.

For example, the church participates in regular mission trips to Peru, where teams serve in the inner city and provide medical clinics in the jungle.

Locally, they are active in distributing food to people in need in the community. Plus, they regularly do outreach activities at local apartment complexes.

Pray that God will to continue to bless Sequoyah Creek Church's efforts to share Jesus and make disciples.



April 14, 2024

Only a few decades ago, the Bugkalot people were one of the fiercest tribes in the Philippines. Then, in the 1950s, the gospel slowly took root after some of the leaders met believers and came to faith.Jen Hagen's family was among the missionaries who moved to the Philippines to disciple and train Bugkalot believers.Jen and her husband, Steve, were sent by the International Mission Board to the Philippines in 2005 to work with the Agta, another unreached tribe similar to the Bugkalot tribe Jen's family ministered among. As soon as they could, they hiked to the village where Jen grew up to speak with many of the men her father discipled.

God used that conversation as the catalyst for Bugkalot believers to catch a vision to take the gospel beyond their tribal borders. Over the next several years, the Hagens worked with other missionaries to help the Bugkalot establish their own sending organization. So far, they have sent more than 20 believers to serve as missionaries among the Agta.

A tribe that used to bring death wherever they went became passionate partners in the life-giving gospel. Pray that the Gospel would take root and transform lives in tough places so that more people would come to faith in Christ.



April 21, 2024

In 2022, Life Community Church sent the Maddens to Weymouth, Massachusetts, to start a church just 16 miles south of Boston. Noah says Greater Boston faces a significant amount of hopelessness and drug addiction. God is using the Maddens to bring hope and healing to the community. When the couple first came to Weymouth, they met Eric, who had struggled through addictions. God not only saved Eric, but also transformed him into a leader in the new church. Today, Eric is leading the church's recovery ministry and helping others give their lives to Jesus and overcome addictions.

The Cooperative Program takes the Gospel to the nations and the neighborhoods. Your support through the Cooperative Program helped Noah graduate from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary debt-free, so he could begin serving Jesus as one of our church's missionaries in New England.

Pray that God continues to draw the people of Weymouth to Himself and uses the Maddens to help them grow as committed disciples.



April 28, 2024

As a 22-year-old Journeyman, Jeri Whitfield saw long-term missionaries commit their lives to God and the people they served. That was her model for missions – a missionary presence that creates gospel access and transforms lives. It's still her desire today, 40 years later.

The first time she left Thailand, she'd finished a two-year Journeyman term. She returned to Thailand as a career missionary in her 40s. At age 55, she faced health concerns and made the difficult decision to retire early.

"My heart was still here. I didn't feel like the job was done."

Once again, now in her 60s, she's returned to the field. Why does she keep returning to reach the nations through the IMB? The answer for Whitfield is simple. She's committed her life to being a steadfast missionary presence, even though the commitment hasn't been easy. God isn't finished using her to reach the nations.

"My experience with missions was that when you're called, it's for life," she said.

Pray that God would embolden Jeri as she so faithfully serves those in Thailand whom God has placed as a burden on her heart.

ARAB-YEMENI

God brings the Arab-Yemerk people to us from the country of Yemen, from the southern part of the Arabian Peninsula. A hostile geopolitical divide exists between the northern Shifte Muslims and the southern Sunni Muslim peoples of Yemen.

There are over 7 million Arab-Yemeni people worldwide, but only a handful of believers. Many of the Arab-Yemeni men will come finat to find a job at local convenience stores in more rural areas of North Carolina. They will work for years until they have enough money to bring the rest of their family to join them in their new lives here. They lave in the Greenville and Fayetteulle areas.

- Pary that Arab Yemenis will hear the voice of the Lord through the witness of N.C. Baptist churches.
- Prey that our churches will use initiatives like ServeNC to bring the pospel to the Arab-Yemeni peoples.

ARAB LEVANT The Arab-Lewant people

The Acab-Lewant people are from the Pertile Crescent, a northward arc between the Persian Guit and the Mediterranean Sea. The Lewant includes parts of iraq, Syria. Jordan, Lebanon, israel and Palestine. There are over 65 million Arab-Lewant people, with only 0.28 percent being evangitical believers. They practica Sumi Islam and show genuine hospitality to strangers.

Many of the Arab-Levant people have lived in North Carolina for 20 years or more and have well-established businesses. There are 16,636 Arab-Levant people living in North Carolina. They live in each of the major metro areas.
